PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Fall 30th Anniversary Conference will offer topics for all levels of practitioners. This coordinated program offers the theory, policy-making, and clinical applications of immunization policy; negative and positive impact of environmental and construction issues; and emerging pathogens, ongoing issues in hand hygiene and patient safety. Participants will be able to identify how the history and staying power of infection control fundamentals affects the evolution of current practice.

OVERALL OBJECTIVES

At the completion of this conference, the participant will be able to:

1. List barriers to handwashing in healthcare and the advantages and limitations of the "alcohol" alternative.
2. Describe past and present background of arbovirus activity in Michigan.
3. Discuss wound infections: most common organisms, culture methods, and the latest in treatment modalities.
4. Define, identify, investigate, and interpret findings in outbreak situations.
5. Identify elements and discuss tools utilized in implementing an effective Construction Related Infection Control Program.
6. Discuss the basic elements of design drawings, including key terms, abbreviations, and details for reading design documents (blueprints).
7. Describe how immunization policy is made and the impact of vaccines on morbidity and mortality, reducing antibiotic-resistant organisms, childhood diseases, smallpox, and emerging infectious disease.
8. Identify engineering causes and cures for legionella.
9. Identify the three plagues of healthcare and the positive effect of a healthy environment on healing and disease prevention.
10. Define device-related patient safety issues.
11. Discuss the ICP's role in patient safety, regulatory and accreditation issues, and the use of the Failure Modes and Effects Analysis.
