## Program Overview

This three-day training program is designed as an introduction to the basic principles of infection prevention and control and epidemiology, which apply to healthcare facilities. The program format includes lecture, interactive work-study, and open discussion.

### Target Audience:

This program is intended for infection control, public health, and other healthcare professionals responsible for, or interested in, infection control program development.

### Objectives:

At the completion of this training course, participants should be able to:

1. State the essentials elements of an infection prevention and control program.
2. List components of facility -specific risk assessment and associated infection prevention and control plan.
3. List state and federal laws pertaining to infection prevention and control for the appropriate setting.
4. Describe the components of a surveillance program, including site definitions for healthcare-associated infections appropriate to a particular practice setting.
5. Describe the components of the chain of infection and describe transmission for common infectious diseases.
6. Define colonization and infection.
7. State the epidemiology, prevention and control of select community and healthcare-associated infections such as tuberculosis, bloodborne pathogens, gastrointestinal illnesses and device-associated infections.
8. Describe the relationship between employee health and infection prevention and control.
9. Describe the collaboration between facility infection prevention and control and public health.
10. Calculate incidence, prevalence and attack rates.
11. Define cleaning, disinfection and sterilization and describe steps for each process.
12. Define medical and sterile aseptic technique and identify when to use each.
13. Describe Implementation of Sharps Injury Prevention Program.
